Supervision as a Condition for Anaesthetic Technicians

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### **Policy Overview**

- 1. Sections 22 (3), (a) and (b) of the Health Practitioners Competence Assurance Act 2003 allow the Council to place a condition on a practitioner's scope of practice as a mechanism for confirming they are competent to practise.
- 2. This document sets out the Council's policy and guidelines for registered anaesthetic technicians (AT) working under supervision to ensure the continued protection of the health and safety of patients.

#### Supervision: Definition

3. Supervision is a formal process of professional support and teaching to enable the practitioner to build on their knowledge, skills and professional attributes, and to progressively assume responsibility for their own practice.

#### Registered Anaesthetic Technician with a Condition on Practice

4. In some circumstances the Council may register an anaesthetic technician with a condition that they complete a specified period of supervision.

## Supervision Overview

	Definition	Specifications	Responsibilities
Supervision	The practitioner providing supervision must be in the same room as the anaesthetic technician under supervision.  Levels 2 and 3  The practitioner providing supervision must be on site and available to give prompt practical assistance and/or advice at any time.	The practitioner works under the supervision of a registered anaesthetic technician who has the expertise and relevant knowledge of anaesthetic technology.	When a condition of supervision is placed on a practitioner's registration, they must provide the Council with the name of the anaesthetic technician who will act as a nominated supervisor.  Anaesthetic technicians providing supervision take full accountability for the practice of the practitioner they supervise.  The nominated supervisor may delegate their daily oversight of a practitioner to another registered anaesthetic technician with the appropriate expertise and relevant knowledge. However, the nominated supervisor retains overall responsibility.

## Levels of Supervision

Definition	Supervisor	Registered Anaesthetic Technician	
The degree of supervision provided to the anaesthetic technician can be reduced over time and as they demonstrate competence in particular procedures/tasks	Level 1 Supervision:  The anaesthetic technician providing supervision must be in the same room as the anaesthetic technician under supervision.	Level 1 Supervision:  - Level 1 supervision applies when the anaesthetic technician being supervised is performing procedures/tasks for which competence sign-off has not been achieved.	
	- The anaesthetic technician providing supervision must be on-site and within a reasonable distance so as to be able to respond promptly should the anaesthetic technician under supervision need assistance and/or advice.	Level 2 Supervision:  - The anaesthetic technician under supervision has been signed-off as competent in the procedures/tasks they are performing.	
	Level 3 Supervision: - Supervisor is available in the hospital but is not exclusively available for a specific supervisee.	Level 3 Supervision:  The anaesthetic technician under supervision has been signed-off as competent in a range of procedures/tasks they would be expected to perform as part of their usual routine but still require sign-off across the whole range of competencies as required for their scope of practice.

	Ensure the health and safety of patients is protected through the practice of the supervised practitioner and the range of tasks for which supervision is provided	Notify the Council:  - if the relationship with the supervised practitioner breaks down - of any concerns regarding the conduct, or health of the supervised practitioner - if the supervised practitioner is not complying with the conditions or undertakings as set by the Council	Adapt their practice to address the remediation of identified areas of practice needing improvement
Have a sound understanding of the competencies required for registration in the anaesthetic technician scope of practice	Maintain a professional relationship with the supervised practitioner	Complete all required supervision reports as set by the Council	Recognise professional limits and work within those limits

	Observe the practitioner, conduct case reviews and provide constructive feedback		

# Competency Sign-Off: Registered Anaesthetic Technician (with supervised practice condition)

5. At the end of the supervision period, the nominated supervisor is required to provide the Council with written confirmation that the anaesthetic technician meets the competence standards for anaesthetic technicians. This is inclusive of ethical practice, awareness of limitations on their practice, professional and cultural competence, and a commitment to lifelong learning.
